

Careers Education Programme

Throughout their time at Alderman Knight School we strive to prepare our pupils for adulthood and ensure they are able to make informed choices about their next steps. We offer a wide range of activities and events which enable pupils to engage with and reflect on the world of work and careers.

A good careers programme needs to have a mixture of theory and practical activities to ensure pupils have the skills and knowledge they need for the world of work.

Classroom Learning

In Key Stage 4 pupils complete a unit of work through their discrete Personal Social Development curriculum on either Applying for Jobs or Courses (AQA PSE Level 1 course) or the Preparation for Work unit (ASDAN PSD Entry Level course). The learning outcomes for these units of work are as follows:

For academic year 2018 – 2019 we are extending our careers programme into the Tutor led Personal Social Development programme of study. This will enable pupils from across the school to engage in careers programme and develop their knowledge and skills of the world of work. Tutors can personalise the programme to be relevant to the needs and the interests of their group. Careers education is incorporated into the Tutor PSD sessions at Key Stage Three and Key Stage four:

Practical experiences

As part of the links with these units of work, pupils also experience a Mock Interview with a local business person in the 'Growth Hub' in Oxstalls. Pupils will prepare for the event by completing an application form and anticipating questions. Afterwards they have useful feedback to help them develop any areas of weakness. It is a great experience to prepare them for real job or college interviews.

Our pupils are also given the opportunities to have meaningful encounters with employers and further exploration into careers and the world of work through a structured focus themed day using the activities and resources from The Real Game Day (year 9 pupils) and The Be Real Game Day (year 11 pupils). On these focus days, local business representatives are invited to come and be part of the day's activities giving pupils a real life business perspective into the concept of work and jobs.

Key Stage 4 pupils have the opportunity to help run the Tewkesbury Abbey Tea Rooms which is taken over by the school every Thursday. They learn a wide range of work-related skills in catering and hospitality and customer service.



Pupils also have opportunities to learn about horticulture in the school garden areas and poly-tunnel. They also learn about enterprise by selling hanging baskets and planted pots.

A further opportunity to gain business enterprise skills is gained by taking part in an enterprise day organised by GFirst LEP. Pupils have to come up with a business idea and pitch it to a group.

In Year 10 the pupils will have the opportunity to do a work experience placement. They are prepared beforehand and keep a log of all learning achieved on placement. Their experience goes towards their CoPE qualification as well as giving great insight into the world of work. In Year 11 they have the chance to do an individual placement again so they can experience a different setting. Pupils unable to access a placement independently will still have the opportunity either through a supported placement or a group visit to a local employer.

A major part of Key Stage 4 is preparing for transition. This is supported by individual and small group visits to local colleges. We ensure each student is aware of all their options and has visited at least two settings for comparison. Once they have chosen their post-16 setting, they have regular link visits to ensure they make a smooth transition.

In Post-16 there is a bigger emphasis on careers education and information as the students are mainly preparing for employment. They are supported by 'Forwards' who help students to prepare their CV and have further practice at interviews and job applications. Students have a day each week to go out on work placement and are encouraged to try a range of different career areas to increase their knowledge, confidence and employability.

Careers Information

Pupils have different learning styles so we ensure careers information is available in many forms.

- Job Explorer Database (JED) All pupils have access to this careers software. They can use it to do
 a short quiz to help them find out what careers they are suited to. They can then access careers
 information and short videos about 852 different jobs.
- <u>Careers library.</u> There are careers booklets, leaflets and college prospectuses available in the careers section in the main library.
- <u>Guest speakers.</u> We invite speakers to talk about general subjects of interest such as college life, apprenticeships, internships and traineeships. We can also access guest speakers at Tewkesbury School if they are coming to talk about a specific career area relevant to our pupils.
- <u>Useful websites.</u> We encourage pupils to use general websites such as the national careers service and <u>www.icould.com</u> to find general information. We teach them how to find specific careers information once they have identified an area of interest.
- <u>Employer visits.</u> Pupils with a specific career in mind can also access information by going for a short visit with relevant employers to increase their understanding.
